

Museum Beat Update April 2021
Reimagine Remake Replay Update

Youth engagement project changing the lives of young people across Northern Ireland continues to thrive in lockdown with the launch of 3 new programmes and introduction of youth-led focused steering groups.

Reimagine Remake Replay has engaged more than 3000 young people in creative programmes, events and workshops in both national and local museums across Northern Ireland over the last two years.

With the continuation of lockdown restrictions and postponement of all face-to-face activity, the RRR team has continued to build on its online engagement model and develop innovative online programmes. The team have delivered online activities which not only provide continued quality engagement with young people, but also strongly focus on museum partner collections and content. Programming since March 2020 has included:

- A three day mental health arts festival, curated by young people.
- Collaboration with the NI Science festival focusing on the climate emergency including talks with Climate activists and a graphic design programme.
- Graphic design & embroidery facemask programmes.
- Creative writing programmes exploring museum collections.
- The impact of fashion- A week of Museum related fashion workshops and events
- Recording the future- An exciting podcast programme where young people's voices will be included in an online exhibition.

In response to the issues raised throughout lockdown, the project has developed several new youth working groups for participants to meet with peers, discuss themes and help feed into wider RRR programming. These include:

- Arts & Wellbeing Group.
- Climate Action Youth Working Group.
- LGBTQIA+ Steering Panel.

The project has also just launched another brand new programme for March 2021:

-A look into lockdown- a mobile photography course exploring the national lockdown.
